**Makers Paradise welcomes the Sierra Watercolor Society to it's Reno Public Market location!**

**Reno Public Market background:** (for more in-depth information about Reno Public Market (complete with links to several fascinating stories), visit Double Scoop's article: <https://www.doublescoop.art/among-the-tenants-of-reno-public-market-opening-in-phases-are-a-few-new-art-venues/> )

For the past two years, the 1960's-era Shoppers Square Mall has undergone renovation. Sprouts and CVS are the anchor tenants, with other retailers located in the parking lot complex. However, there is much more to offer inside the main building. An incredible attraction will be the food court, with 18 purveyors, a central bar, and stage for performances, slated to be fully open in January. Bordering the west entrance hallway are the following offerings:

- **Wyld Market** headquarters where artists and other producers can sell their products on consignment and can rent a booth on a monthly, weekly, or daily basis.

- **Far Out** the new concept store for Coalition Snow, a local ski and snowboard brand that's operated by and caters to women. Inside the new shop, there is a range of creative clothing and housewares. Many out-of-store offerings include snow sports travel packages, yoga retreats, and an Indigenous Backcountry Scholarship.
- **Zawadisha** This business is a nonprofit that provides micro loans and other forms of enterprise support to craftswomen in Kenya. The compact space is stocked with hand-carved wooden spoons, baskets large and small, and a range of other housewares.
- **Makers Paradise Gallery** this soon-to-be full service gallery will be available for SWS exhibiting, complete with an access hall to our new meeting area.

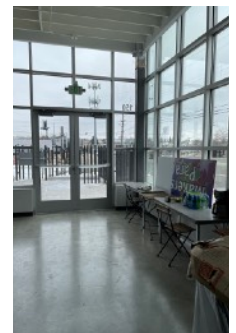
The new home for Sierra Watercolor Society:

Our new meeting and workshop home is housed in the remodeled 2-story industrial space at the back of the main building. Primary access is off of the western end of Casazza Drive. First you must pass through a small outdoor courtyard which is bordered by an artsy vertical pipe fence/gate. We will be meeting in the ground level classroom area - studio spaces occupy the second floor. There is limited parking on Casazza Street, in a small lot adjacent to Andy's Lock and Keys and IHOP, and ample parking in front of the main complex, off of Plumb Lane. Our formal address for Reno Public Market is 299 Plumb Lane, Suite 155.

Makers Paradise, administrators:

A branch of a Berkeley-based makerspace, Makers Paradise is a non-profit that promotes community art engagement through diverse services. They will be developing and managing art events, as well as training programs for emerging and underserved artists and makers. Makers Paradise embraces a synergetic team approach that creates a collaborative work environment, fostering artistic ideas, art and culture.

One of the team's priorities has been to offer studio space and training to veterans and people with disabilities. They plan to keep with that tradition in Reno, and are working with the Reno VA Medical Center to offer art therapy sessions.

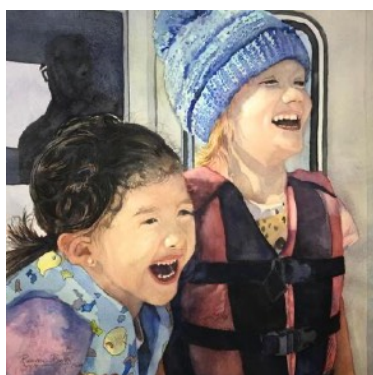

### A note from member Reid Sewell, the "exhibit compliance man":

Hello fellow artists - I have not rejected any paintings from the last two exhibits, however, I have noticed several cases where there was a lack of attention to the appearance of the back of the paintings. Even though nails or paper staples are not banned, they look crude compared with other inexpensive hardware.

An alternative that I would suggest would be hinged hangers instead of eyelets - these can be found at Nevada Fine Arts.

If it is unavoidable to use nails or staples, the back of the painting can be simply covered using Kraft paper, which is then glued to the rear of the frame.

Particularly for those who are re-using a frame (which might have torn paper or residue and/or scratches), I have some suggestions that might help you provide a more professional looking painting. If anybody is interested in learning my method for doing a wood frame quick fix for scratches, as well as other compliance suggestions, I would be more than willing to give a 15 minute demo at an upcoming meeting.

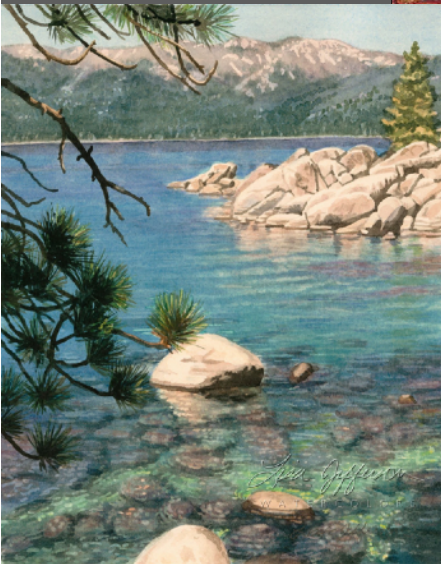

## PAINTING CHALLENGES

### January 14th 2023 General Meeting “Splatter Watercolor Technique”

Challenge description from chair Graciela Mancini: One definition of “Splattering”: A technique in which paint is flung with the flick of a brush onto the painting surface, it creates interesting textural effects depending on the type of brush used.

Have fun with this challenge which allows for experimentation using different shaped brushes, colors and even just plain water!



#### RULES FOR ALL CHALLENGES (Entries must meet the following Challenge rules exactly - NO EXCEPTIONS):

- Do **not** sign your painting.
- Entries must fit the **theme**.
- Entries must be **new**, having been painted specifically for the Challenge.
- Unless your painting will be a sealed painting, entries must be **matted** (no need to be framed).
- You may not enter a challenge painting into a **second** Challenge, even if it fits the theme.
- Entries cannot have been shown in an **exhibit prior** to the Challenge.

At the General Meeting, Challenge paintings are displayed, unsigned and members vote for their favorite based on adherence to the challenge theme and quality of work.

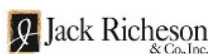
