EXHIBIT NEWS

- SWS closed the Bouquets to Reno's 150th Birthday Exhibit on June 2, 2018. We had 37 artists participating and a total of 75 pieces including bin art. Sold were Virginia McLaughlin's Spring Fling, Colleen Reynolds' Wild Lupine bin art, and Vicki Curwen's Horse Haven bin art. The People's Choice ribbon was awarded to Lisa Jefferson for "Awakening", 2nd People's Choice went to Larry Jacox for "Little Last Chance Creek" and 3rd top votes went to Kathyrn Dudley's "Tahoe Spring". Show Chair, Marjee Smith and Co-Chair, Cheryl Keaveney wish to thank all the following volunteers: Sandy Retter, Joycette Dapra, Molly Dondero, Kay Tietz, Jane Chapman, Ruth Jaeger, Tricia Leonard, Gail Kramer, Lisa Jefferson, Barb Kallestad, Vicki Curwen, Lynn Schmidt, and Eileen Fuller.
- The "Anything Goes" Show presenting alternatively-finished and framed (or not!) watercolor artwork. Ronnie Rector and Linda Parisi are Co-Chairs. The exhibit is up now at the Sparks Library at 1125 12th St. until July 28. Take-Down Day will be Saturday, July 28, 11 to 1. Paintings are sealed with wax, varnish or other permanent fixatives, with or without frames, glass and mats. The allowable format for the exhibit is either 2 small or one large (up to full sheet) paintings.
- The annual judged exhibit, "The Biggest Little Watercolor Show", will be held at the Sparks Heritage Museum. Entry day is August 10 from 11-1; take down October 1, 11-1; Reception September 22 from 1-4 pm; Julie Gilbert Pollard, judge. The categories will be the same as last year: Portraits/Figures; Fur, Fins & Feathers; Abstract; Floral/Still life; and Landscape. Framed paintings: two per artist, only one full size. Entry forms will be available on the website at least a month before entry day, as well as exhibit guidelines. - The **Winter Exhibit** will be at the May Museum with Diane Sewell as Chair Person. Take-in will be on November 13 from 11-1 with the exhibit opening on November 14. Take-down will be on December 16 from 11-1. The SWS Holiday Brunch will take place there on December 1.

AUGUST CHALLENGE by Judy Berland

"Challenge for August 2018: "I Need_____!" (fill in the blank)

Michael Heaton, Alvaro Castagnet, two of the many winning and selling artists say "Every painting must tell a story, not just a pretty picture!". Novelists take about 300 pages to tell a story; they have to catch the interest of the reader in the first chapter. We artists are authors, but we only have one page to capture the viewer. I do not see too many paintings where I know what the artist is trying to tell me, so for August you are to paint a story! *Examples:* Portrait of a sad face; either the person is saying, "I need a hug!" or the artist is saying: I need you to remember Sept.11, (or the Holocaust), etc. *Figure barefoot with torn clothes:* person is saying "I need shoes!" or the artist is saying, "I need you to be aware of the homeless in Reno". *Floral:* subject is saying I need water! (or a Vase) or the artist is saying,"I need you to appreciate nature and help save planet earth. The story may be obvious; if not, put a note underneath: "I need______!", (whatever you want the viewer to understand as to why you chose the subject).

RULES FOR ALL CHALLENGES:

Entries will not be accepted unless they meet the following Challenge rules exactly - NO EXCEPTIONS

- 1. Do not sign your painting.
- 2. Entries must fit the theme.
- 3. Entries must be matted (they do not need to be framed).
- 4. Entries may only be submitted into one Challenge. You may not enter a challenge painting into a second Challenge, even if it fits the theme.
- 5. Entries must be new, having been painted specifically for the Challenge.
- 6. Entries cannot have been shown in an exhibit prior to the Challenge.

NEWS FROM THE BOARD

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT, RONNIE RECTOR

July 2018:

A motorcycle just drove up, one of the smaller, quiet ones. From my desk I watch as the rider takes off his safety gear - gloves and a helmet with a skull and roses painted on the side. He's probably coming in to pay a bill. We don't see many motorcycles here at the office. Incliners seem to prefer Jeep Cherokees and Range Rovers: all 4 tires firmly on the ground.

Kind of puts me in mind of plein air painting. Throwing just a few necessary items in a backpack and getting out in the fresh air. Taking a break from painting at the dining room table to swat at bugs, slather on sunscreen, balance a watercolor pad on my knee and observe what's going on around me. My safety gear is sunscreen, hat, jug of water and a friend or two. We usually don't hike that far – from the parking area to the beach at Sand Harbor, to Spooner Lake, or halfway up the Lodgepole run at Diamond Peak.

Once, just a short walk off Mt. Rose Highway, I met a young couple with 2 small children and 3 rented llamas, taking a pack-camping tour along the Tahoe Rim Trail. I never knew you could rent llamas! There's a painting in there somewhere, I just haven't come up with it yet.

I've never created a successful painting on these day trips, but the feeling that comes from being outside with friends, listening to the creek or the lake, the breeze and the birds, breathing fresh air and soaking up some sun, makes it all worthwhile.

I hope winter has finally stormed off for the last time this year, so we can all get outside for a bit. To paint, to kayak, to hike or garden; whatever makes you happy will surely show up in your art!

Learn how to make water look wet, reflective and splashy! With a stunning waterfall or intimate woodsy creek as your model, study watercolor in motion and glassy reflection. Painting water color that looks wet requires some basic knowledge of the dynamics of how water moves and how objects are reflected in its mirror surface. Techniques will be demonstrated to address the various puzzles which the artist is faced when painting this stunning, fascinating and challenging subject. Reference photos will be supplied, or you may use your own.

Studio lessons will focus on:

- Cascading water the "anatomy" of a waterfall
- Reflections

- Negative painting lessons for the watercolorist
- Color theory, simplified (as needed or requested)

There will be demos, instruction at all levels, critique and lots of painting time. Class time will be structured, yet open enough to accommodate the artistic spirit within all of us all. About the Workshop:

During David Lobenberg's workshop, you will learn portraiture that goes beyond the norm with super expressive paint applications and wildly intense colors. This will be accomplished by:

- 1. Learning how to take dramatic, stylistic photographs with a camera, smart phone, or computer pad
- 2. Learning a simple technique to trace contour outlines from your photographs that can easily transferred to any size of watercolor paper
- 3. Learning to economically and with minimal brush strokes, render head structure and facial features
- 4. Working with minimal color palette and the four basic water/pigment consistencies to render strong value contrasts, subtle tints, and intense hues
- 5. Painting 1/8 sheet "pochades" (small paintings) to quickly explore both paint application and techniques and expressive color combinations
- 6. Using your pochade(s) as a guide to paint your final California VIBE, beyond-the-norm portrait(s)

About the Artist:

David has emerged onto the national and international art scene with his signature "California VIBE" Watercolor Portraiture style has resulted in exhibits and publications in Europe, the Middle East, Asia (where he was invited by the Thailand Ministry of Culture to participate in the First International Water Media Exhibit), and the United States (Artist Magazine, Southwest Art, Art Collector, Plein Air Magazine, and the Palette Magazine). He teaches this workshop though many of the states and with multiple Watercolor Societies. He distributes a monthly workshop newsletter.

The exhibition will be at the San Diego Watercolor Society Gallery from September 29 - October 30. The juror was John Salminen.


