PAINTING CHALLENGES

Chairperson Graciela Mancini

May 11th General Meeting "A Snowy or Rainy Day in the City" Challenge

The idea for this challenge came to me after spending a week in CA, where it rained every day, and the vast amount of snow viewed in the Sierra coming back to Reno, when I-80 was re-opened after 4 days! I researched two artist well known for painting rain/snow in the city. The first one was Alvaro Castagnet - his loose style to portray mood and atmosphere builds on his basic 4-pillars:

- * 1- shapes, 2- colors, 3- values, and 4- edges.
- * Be aware of the 3 shapes to include: large, medium and small
- * Keep it simple by using mainly large shapes.

The other painter I researched was Paul Clark - his suggestions when painting a cityscape include:

- * Keep the drawing simple, establish the vanishing point, decide if you are going to have more than one point (the simplest is to have only one).
- * Keep the proportions right, e.g. people compared to cars and buildings, decreasing sizes as they move toward the vanishing point.
- * Choose which shapes will be depicted vaguely or accurately.

The rendering of snow and rain in the city is a complex subject and will force us to choose few elements to simplify the scene.

I suggest to search also the works of:

- * Jonathan Janson
- * Jiaur Rahman

Have fun, can't wait to see your cityscapes!


