EXHIBIT NEWS

- "Bouquets to Reno's 150th Birthday" is currently up at the May Museum. Take-down is June 3, 12-2 pm.
- The "Anything Goes" Show presenting alternatively-finished and framed (or not!) watercolor artwork. The exhibit will be at the Sparks Library at 1125 12th St. from June 30 to July 28. Take-In Day is Friday, June 29, 11 to 1. Take-Down Day is Saturday, July 28, 11 to 1. Ronnie Rector and Linda Parisi are Co-Chairs. This exhibit is for paintings freed from the confines of our Standing Rules for framing and matting: paintings sealed with wax, varnish or other permanent fixatives, with or without frames, glass and mats. Older paintings will be accepted, as long as they are "alternatively presented," clean, and in good condition. All work must be wired for hanging (no sawtooth hangers or easel backs), backs must be clean and neat, and finished in a clean, professional-looking state. Sizes acceptable will be 8x10 minimum, 11x14 maximum, as measured around the **outside edges** framed or unframed due to space limitations.
- The annual judged exhibit, "The Biggest Little Watercolor Show", will be held at the Sparks Heritage Museum. Entry day is August 10 from 11-1; take down October 1, 11-1; Reception September 22 from 1-4 pm; Julie Gilbert Pollard, judge. The categories will be the same as last year: Portraits/Figures; Fur, Fins & Feathers; Abstract; Floral/Still life; and Landscape. Framed paintings: two per artist, only one full size. The plans originally had for downstairs have been cancelled so there will only be bin art downstairs. Co-chair Julene Hunter is working with Alicia Cobb on the on-line entry which will include bios that will be required this year. The Chairs are also thinking of having photos of the paintings for the exhibit on the entry form as well. Entry forms will be available on the website at least a month before entry day, as well as exhibit guidelines. Any questions, please phone Ruth Jaeger (775 335-9899) or Julene Hunter (775 233-0389)
- The Winter Exhibit will be at the May Museum with Diane Sewell as Chair Person. Take-in will be on November 13 from 11-1 with the exhibit opening on November 14. Take-down will be on December 16 from 11-1. The SWS Holiday Brunch will take place there on December 1.

AUGUST CHALLENGE by Judy Berland

"Challenge for August 2018: "I Need_____!" (fill in the blank)

Michael Heaton, Alvaro Castagnet, two of the many winning and selling artists say "Every painting must tell a story, not just a pretty picture!". Novelists take about 300 pages to tell a story; they have to catch the interest of the reader in the first chapter. We artists are authors, but we only have one page to capture the viewer. I do not see too many paintings where I know what the artist is trying to tell me, so for August you are to paint a story! *Examples:* Portrait of a sad face; either the person is saying, "I need a hug!" or the artist is saying: I need you to remember Sept.11, (or the Holocaust), etc. Figure barefoot with torn clothes: person is saying "I need shoes!" or the artist is saying, "I need you to be aware of the homeless in Reno". Floral: subject is saying I need water! (or a Vase) or the artist is saying,"I need you to appreciate nature and help save planet earth. The story may be obvious; if not, put a note underneath: "I need ______!", (whatever you want the viewer to understand as to why you chose the subject).

RULES FOR ALL CHALLENGES:

Entries will not be accepted unless they meet the following Challenge rules exactly - NO EXCEPTIONS

- 1. Do not sign your painting.
- 2. Entries must fit the theme.
- 3. Entries must be matted (they do not need to be framed).
- 4. Entries may only be submitted into one Challenge. You may not enter a challenge painting into a second Challenge, even if it fits the theme.
- Entries must be new, having been painted specifically for the Challenge.
- 6. Entries cannot have been shown in an exhibit prior to the Challenge.

NEWS FROM THE BOARD

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT, RONNIE RECTOR

June 2018:

A motorcycle just drove up, one of the smaller, quiet ones. From my desk I watch as the rider takes off his safety gear - gloves and a helmet with a skull and roses painted on the side. He's probably coming in to pay a bill. We don't see many motorcycles here at the office. Incliners seem to prefer Jeep Cherokees and Range Rovers: all 4 tires firmly on the ground.

Kind of puts me in mind of plein air painting. Throwing just a few necessary items in a backpack and getting out in the fresh air. Taking a break from painting at the dining room table to swat at bugs, slather on sunscreen, balance a watercolor pad on my knee and observe what's going on around me. My safety gear is sunscreen, hat, jug of water and a friend or two. We usually don't hike that far – from the parking area to the beach at Sand Harbor, to Spooner Lake, or halfway up the Lodgepole run at Diamond Peak.

Once, just a short walk off Mt. Rose Highway, I met a young couple with 2 small children and 3 rented llamas, taking a pack-camping tour along the Tahoe Rim Trail. I never knew you could rent llamas! There's a painting in there somewhere, I just haven't come up with it yet.

I've never created a successful painting on these day trips, but the feeling that comes from being outside with friends, listening to the creek or the lake, the breeze and the birds, breathing fresh air and soaking up some sun, makes it all worthwhile.

I hope winter has finally stormed off for the last time this year, so we can all get outside for a bit. To paint, to kayak, to hike or garden; whatever makes you happy will surely show up in your art!





About the Workshop:

During David Lobenberg's workshop, you will learn portraiture that goes beyond the norm with super expressive paint applications and wildly intense colors. This will be accomplished by:

- 1. Learning how to take dramatic, stylistic photographs with a camera, smart phone, or computer pad
- 2. Learning a simple technique to trace contour outlines from your photographs that can easily transferred to any size of watercolor paper
- 3. Learning to economically and with minimal brush strokes, render head structure and facial features
- 4. Working with minimal color palette and the four basic water/pigment consistencies to render strong value contrasts, subtle tints, and intense hues
- 5. Painting 1/8 sheet "pochades" (small paintings) to quickly explore both paint application and techniques and expressive color combinations
- 6. Using your pochade(s) as a guide to paint your final California VIBE, beyond-the-norm portrait(s) **About the Artist:**

David has emerged onto the national and international art scene with his signature "California VIBE" Watercolor Portraiture style has resulted in exhibits and publications in Europe, the Middle East, Asia (where he was invited by the Thailand Ministry of Culture to participate in the First International Water Media Exhibit), and the United States (Artist Magazine, Southwest Art, Art Collector, Plein Air Magazine, and the Palette Magazine). He teaches this workshop though many of the states and with multiple Watercolor Societies. He distributes a monthly workshop newsletter.

We received very positive feedback, as well as \$59 in tips!

May Museum, as part of Artown: 9:30-11:30 a.m. and 1-3 p.m. I still need three instructors for the morning session and four instructors for the afternoon session, as well as an alternate for each time frame. And I need one person to greet the children & mat their paintings in the morning, plus two in the afternoon. For general helpers I need seven more for each session. Anyone working both shifts will be given lunch. Please let me know if you can instruct or help for either session or both sessions. Thank you!

The classroom visits are nearing an end for this school year. Many thanks to **Gail Kramer, Linda James, JR Stafford, Bess Inouye, Cheryl Keaveney, Nancy LeSage,** and **Eileen Fuller,** who helped with the recent classes as Jesse Hall Elementary and Bernice Mathews Elementary. The children and teachers were so appreciative.

By the time you receive this Newsletter, there will be only one more classroom visit with which I need help: <u>Friday</u>, June 8, 12:25-3:30 p.m. at Spanish Springs Elementary, 100 Marilyn Mae, Sparks: need two helpers, one alternate. Please let me know if you are available. Thanks.

I have not started scheduling classes for the 2018-19 school year, but will probably begin to do so shortly. Please let me know of particular interests and availability, and I will keep you posted as classes are scheduled.

PUBLICITY

I continue to post notices about our exhibits and guest artist demos on several online calendars, with information sometimes appearing in print (Reno News & Review) or on the air (KUNR Arts Calendar). Julene Hunter has agreed to work on creating a page for SWS on the Community Foundation of Western Nevada's Non-Profits site, with links to our website; thank you so much, Julene! (The Community Foundation of Western Nevada is a primary source of referrals of donors looking for worthy non-profits.) Others who would like to help spread the word about SWS activities would be much appreciated, whether via other arts groups' newsletters or elsewhere. Please contact me if you have questions.

As many of you know, I applied to the Nevada Arts Council for an Arts Learning Project Grant to fund several SWS activities, including supplies for Art Angels. The grants hearing was on May 24th. We did well at the Grants Hearing: we received the second highest score in the category of "Arts Learning Projects" and will probably get about \$4000 for Art Angels, marketing, DVDs, exhibits and

workshops for the 2018-19 fiscal year. Many thanks to **Linda James** and **Ronnie Rector,** who proofread the grant application and offered suggestions.

The next meeting of the Reno Arts Consortium will be on Thursday, June 21, from 9-10:30 a.m. at the McKinley Arts & Culture Center on Riverside Drive. I cannot be there, but would encourage any of you who are available to attend: it's a great opportunity to meet major players in our arts community and learn what's happening!
