#### A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT - Ronnie Rector

As the seasons change, I'm thinking about temperatures. It's in the 30's in the morning as I drive to work, and mid-seventies as I drive home. Fall in the Sierra – heater on in the morning, windows open going home - and loving every minute of it!

As artists, we need to think about temperature in our paintings. Values are easy to see – light vs dark. But temperature can be challenging. "Is this red a cool red or a warm red?" Obviously. this will depend on what colors are next to it - the "local colors." Put the red next to cerulean blue (a cool blue), the red will appear warm. Put it next to a color like gamboge or quinacridone gold (my favorite), it's going to appear colder.

This is an important part of art, especially when rendering shadows and contours. It's all about light and shadow. The value difference is obvious - where the top of an apple dips down to its stem, or making the back leg on an animal look like it's a back leg, the values of the shadow will provide the impression that, yes, that part is curving away from us or is behind the other leg. But what is the temperature of that shadow...is it warm or cool?

North light is a cool light. South light is warm. Think of painting the shadows at Taylor Creek in Galena in November, as opposed to the shadows in a canyon in El Paso, Texas in summer. Typically, cool light creates warmer shadows; warm light creates cooler shadows. Yes, there are exceptions to this, but it's fun to really pay attention and "see" the warmth...or chill...in your painting!

# **PAINTING CHALLENGES**

# January 20th General Meeting "The Value of a Value Study" Challenge

✓ Please note: You will need to present **both** the value study and the resulting painting

According to Tom Hoffman, a well known watercolorist, obtaining a successful watercolor painting requires a great deal of thought and planning - there are many variables affecting the final result. One of his recommendations is to create a monochromatic value study of the subject to be painted. Why? What role does 'value' play?

Defining big shape values into a few categories helps us understand dark/light relationships. By limiting the number of values in the study, the painting process is simplified, and also builds the cohesiveness of the painting.

How to do it: First complete your sketch. Then, on dry paper, start applying paint, using only one color. The first application is done with a light-mid value to cover almost the entire paper with the exception of the white areas you want to reserve. The second application is done with a dark-mid value on the areas to define shapes and separate spacial planes. The last application is the dark value (the darkest darks) to make your center of interest really pop. This study will have 4 values: white, light-mid value, dark-mid value and dark value.

Alternative sketching tools include pencil, ArtGraf (watersoluble graphite), charcoal, Tombow pen, etc. Many professional artists advocate doing preliminary value studies - following are several informative youtubes:





The show is titled, Shared Visions: A Retrospective by Marlin Rotach and Don Weller.

This is a two-fold concept displaying artistic development as well as presenting a large body of work in their full mature style. 




