A 4x6 photo of the original old painting must be propped up against the new one; and if the new one is different enough and has followed the rules of this challenge, the Challenge Committee will OK it to be put in a future SWS Exhibit and the 2 year and all Exhibit rules will apply.

RULES FOR ALL CHALLENGES:

Entries will not be accepted unless they meet the following Challenge rules exactly - NO EXCEPTIONS

- 1. Do not sign your painting.
- 2. Entries must fit the theme.
- 3. Entries must be matted (they do not need to be framed).
- 4. Entries may only be submitted into one Challenge. You may not enter a challenge painting into a second Challenge, even if it fits the theme.
- 5. Entries must be new, having been painted specifically for the Challenge.
- 6. Entries cannot have been shown in an exhibit prior to the Challenge.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT, RONNIE RECTOR

December 2018:

Hard to believe I've had the honor of being your Pres for a whole year now. Yikes, where does the time go? I want to wish you a most joyous holiday season, filled with family, friends, light and laughter. Now...anyone interested in taking on the President role in 2020? Please! Email me if you are even slightly considering it. I'll be happy to meet with you for dinner and beverages and go over what you'd expect!

I've been away on vacation and came back to work today to over 200 emails to wade through, about 85% of which were quickly deleted as garbage. Let's talk about hoaxes, viruses, and general deadbeats out to steal your money. Bear with me if you already know this, but these are making the rounds again and I feel it's important.

We've all gotten those weird emails from a friend asking for help because they're stuck in some foreign land without a credit card, passport, etc., and asking you to wire them money via Western Union. This is a hoax. A good way to see if an email is really from your friend is to hover your mouse pointer over the sender's name in your "Inbox." Your computer will show you, for about a second, the hidden address this email actually came from. As you can see in the screenshot, below, the email address for my husband, David, is fake, so I know it is junk, and delete it immediately.



Viruses come from clicking on what looks like a harmless link inside an email you've received from one of the phonies described above, or from clicking on the little flashy ads you see on the sides of your monitor when you're checking your email or browsing the internet. These often carry "Trojan Horse" viruses that will wreak havoc on your computer. If you're interested in a product you see, look it up using Google or another official search engine, so you know you're actually being directed to a real company.

Another hoax going around all the time is the email from some fellow saying he saw your artwork "while visiting the area," and wanted to surprise his wife for her birthday. He even offers to send a courier to pick up the artwork. Do not respond. This scam artist actually mails you a cashier's check for much more than your asking price. You deposit the check, and within a day or two, he contacts you again, says his "solicitor" or "accountant" made a mistake, and asks for a refund of the extra money. This is how he steals from you. You mail him a check, it gets cashed, and a month or so later, his phony check bounces. You've lost whatever 'refund' you sent him. No courier ever shows up, either.

I hope this helps to keep your computers safe and your bank accounts happy! Seasoned Greetings, stay healthy, and enjoy the onslaught of WINTER!



About the Artist: Stan Miller was born on a small farm in SE South Dakota. He was one of 7 children. Stan moved to Spokane, WA when he was 15 years old and graduated from Spokane Falls Community College with an Applied Arts Degree and a Commercial Art Degree. He remembers getting a "C" in his first watercolor class so took the class again and received an "A". This is when he fell in love with watercolor. He has been teaching since 1976 and loves it almost as much as painting. His awards are numerous such as ones from The American Watercolor Society International Exhibition (NYC), Quindao International Watercolor Exhibition (China), Artist Magazine National Competition, and Grand Prize from Watercolor Magic National Competition.

About the workshop: In Stan's workshop, he will be guiding the students through both, portrait and landscape subjects. Handouts of both portrait and landscape will be provided each day.
